SQUASH CHAMPIONS – Keeping it in the Family!

Junior KCC members, Annie Au, and younger brother, Leo, are blazing a family trail into the history books of Hong Kong Squash.

Annie has served notice in emphatic style that she is heir apparent to Hong Kong's leading women's squash player, fellow KCC member Rebecca Chiu. In September 2008, Annie secured her 3rd WISPA professional squash title – the Taiwan Squash Open – by demolishing World No 22, Malaysia's Sharon Wee, 3-0 in the final.

The month before, Annie beat the three top seeds on consecutive days to win her first major Championship – the Australian Open. In the final, Annie came from 0-2 down, then saved 2 match points to defeat No 1 seed, Australian Kasey Brown, in five thrilling games before holding aloft a trophy previously graced by many of the greatest names in Women's Squash.

Not to be outdone by his elder sister, Leo has also enjoyed a remarkable year in squash. In 2008, aged 18 years, Leo has won the Australian Junior Squash Series (1st & 2nd Classic) and the Asian Junior Squash Individual Championship... and he recently became the Hong Kong Junior Squash Open Champion!

Annie and Leo both play their HKSRA League Squash representing the KCC Ladies' and Men's teams – eloquent testimony to the value of our Junior Membership Programme in our continuing quest to attract and retain top youngsters in their chosen sports.
